# **ELECTRICITY SAFETY: LESSONS FOR LIFE**

ONLY 19 % OF ONTARIANS FEEL THEY KNOW ENOUGH ABOUT POWERLINES TO KEEP SAFE

### DID YOU KNOW? Amp Up On Your Electricity and Powerline Safety Knowledge

- DOWNED POWERLINES: Always assume all downed powerlines are energized and
  potentially lethal. Anything that comes into contact with a downed powerline, including
  the surrounding ground and tree limbs, could be energized. Stay back the length of a
  school bus 10 metres or 33 feet and call 1-877-310-4937 to report it.
- POWERLINES ON YOUR CAR: If a powerline falls on your vehicle, CALL 9-1-1 immediately. Stay where you are until help arrives and power is disconnected.
- WORKING NEAR POWERLINES: Before you start any work in the yard make sure you
  know where the powerlines are and stay a minimum of 3 meters away with ladders and
  tools. Carry ladders horizontally and always check before extending or moving your
  ladder. Even wooden ladders can conduct electricity.

- CALL BEFORE YOU DIG: Anytime you dig on your property from planting a tree to building a deck – contact 'Ontario One Call'. Never assume you know the location or depth of a powerline. Always get this free locate service before you dig. IT'S THE LAW: ontarioonecall.ca or 1-800-400-2255.
- PAD-MOUNTED GREEN TRANSFORMERS: It's dangerous to tamper with green padmounted transformer boxes. Teach your children never to play on or near them. Do not plant within 3 metres of the front or 1.5 metres of its back and sides.
- FLOODING: Stay away from flooded areas. Assume flooded basements and all submersed areas could be electrified. Call 1-877-310-4937 to have the power disconnected.
- OUR CREWS AT WORK: Please drive with caution when approaching or passing Burlington Hydro crews. They often make repairs during inclement weather when driving conditions can be at their worse.

## What actions does Burlington Hydro take first in a power outage?

Extreme weather events put every community at risk for power outages. At Burlington Hydro, storm response efforts are coordinated with these priorities in mind:

- Assess and prioritize all outages on a case-by-case basis ensuring foremost that customers are safe and informed Restore power first to hospitals, emergency services and critical infrastructure
- 2. Repair damage to main feeders and substations which service large numbers of customers Collaborate with the City and all emergency response organizations when and where required
- 3. Restore power to the entire community as quickly and as safely as possible
